SUCCESS STORY:

MOODY BLUES TRADING AND INVEST 17

Our dreams and ambitions are what drive us to succeed. So it is with a man called Elliot Ngomane. Elliot obtained a farm between the beautiful mountains of Low's Creek in Mpumalanga, where he started trading as 'Moody Blues Trading and Invest 17' in 2005. He planted sugarcane on his 13ha of land, but due to the fact that cane is only harvested once a year, he struggled to keep the farm afloat during the rest of the year. Life was tough and he decided that nothing will stop him from achieving his dream, and to look for help. He approached MASDT in 2012 and was included into the incubation program.

After meetings and close deliberation with our client, it was decided that he will plant vegetables such as cabbage and tomatoes to supplement the farm's income. MASDT helped Mr. Ngomane with the development of a business plan, which he submitted to the Department of Rural Development and Land Reform (DRDLR). The Department subsequently granted him the amount of R 2.1 million, with which he purchased more land and increased his property to 49ha! It was such a joyous day for the Ngomane family, their tearful gratitude have touched our hearts and will never be forgotten.

Then the intensive training and mentorship started. The program included training from vegetable planting and production to administrative duties to name a few. Working closely with MASDT, the farmer also benefitted by purchasing production materials and essentials on discounted prices.

As a result of the bigger land and better planning methods, the farm could increase its sugarcane yield from 13ha to a staggering 40ha, and with the assistance of our Procurement Program, Moody Blues Trading has secured a market for their product through TSB.

With the extra funding and increased scale of production, Moody Blues Trading could employ more workers, hiking the number from four permanent employees up to seven. The business went from strength to strength. The turnover escalated from R800 000.00 in 2013-2014, to almost R1.4 million in 2014-2015!

Moody Blues Trading is a business that we are proud of. MASDT helped someone who had drive and passion but lacked valuable agricultural knowledge and funds. Moody Blues Trading is one of the incubatees set to graduate this year, and we are happy to say that this is one business to look out for as it is has already taken the market by storm with our guidance. We are confident that they will keep on building on their success without us, and MASDT waits in anticipation to see what the year 2016 have in store for them.
